Legal Authority	<p>California Pharmacy Law In reference to Veterinary practice, the BOP:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Requires that veterinarians notify clients in writing of their right to obtain a written prescription free of charge upon request (California Business and Professions Code section 4170(a)(6) and (7)). • Oversees Veterinary Food Animal Drug Retailers (VFADRs) (California Business and Professions Code Article 15, sections 4196-4199)
What it means to you	<p>If you feel that a pharmacy is violating the law by improperly filling a prescription or labeling a medication, or if a pharmacy is operating without a California permit, you may file a complaint with the BOP.
